Fr Kevin is a native of Dublin & currently Administrator of Sacred Heart Parish, Dublin. He was Secretary General of the very successful Eucharistic Congress in 2012. We look forward to his leadership and shepherding of our Diocese.

Excerpts from "Words of greeting to the faithful by Bishop-elect Kevin Doran" I must confess to being a little surprised to find myself here this morning. God is always calling us &, while we can only see a short way ahead, He has a plan for each one of us, which extends beyond time into eternity.

It is the role of the bishop to be the servant of Communion & he carries out his ministry under three particular headings, as a teacher of faith, as one who leads the people in the celebration of the liturgy, & through the administration of the diocese (cf. LG 20). The bishop is not called to be a "lone ranger". The service of communion includes recognising the diverse gifts which the Spirit has given to everyone in the community & making it possible for those gifts to be developed & placed at the service of all.

Much of the energy of Jesus went into gathering people & forming community. Much of our energy today seems to go into organising people. It sometimes seems that, while there is an enormous amount of contact, there isn't that much real communication. Many people, both in the city & in the countryside remain lonely & isolated; the elderly; the homeless & even young people. "The joys & the hopes, the grief & the anguish" of the people of our time are part of the concern of the Church.

I'll end with a story. A few weeks after I was ordained, I came to Sligo to spend a few days with friends who were students with me in Rome. One morning I celebrated Mass at St John's Hospital &, when I came to the washing of the hands at the Offertory, I heard a man's voice from the back of the chapel saying quite audibly "please God wash away the priests' sins". That man, for all his simplicity, had the mind of the Church. He is long gone now, but the priest is still here and still in need of that same prayer. Thank you and God bless you all.
