

<u>Tweet success for the Pope: Francis beats Obama into second place as he is</u> named the most influential user on the planet

Pope Francis is the most influential Twitter user – or 'tweep' - in the world, a new study has revealed. Although the Argentine Jesuit Pontiff is the second most followed world leader after Barack Obama, he massively outstrips the US

President in the frequency with which his followers retweet his messages. This makes him the most influential 'tweep' on the planet according to Twiplomacy 2014, a study of how Twitters is being used by world leaders. More than 14 million people follow the Pope at @Pontifex in nine languages and each tweet made by the Pontiff is on average retweeted nearly 17,000 times, Twiplomacy revealed in a final report. Although President Obama has 43.7 million followers of his @BarackObama account, his tweets are only retweeted an average of 1,400 times, meaning that the Holy Father's tweets are retweeted more than 10 times as often. Pope Francis Urges Young People Not To Waste Time on Internet

Pope Francis on Tuesday urged 50,000 German altar servers not to waste time on the Internet, smartphones and television, but to spend their time on more productive activities. "Maybe many young people waste too many hours on futile things," the pope said in a short speech to the altar servers — young people who help the priest during religious services — who had come to Rome on a pilgrimage. "Our life is made up of time, and time is a gift from God, so it is important that it be used in good and fruitful actions." Activities cited by Francis as futile were: "chatting on the Internet or with smartphones, watching TV soap operas, and (using) the products of technological progress, which should simplify and improve the quality of life, but distract attention away from what is really important."

The 77-year-old pope has Twitter accounts in several languages. They were first used by his predecessor Benedict in 2011, and his English-language account has 4.3 million followers. Francis has described the Internet as a "gift from God," but also cautioned that high-speed world of digital social media needed calm, reflection and tenderness if it was to be "a network not of wires but of people."
