



The day we remember the heartbreak and tragedy of road deaths.

Today is World Remembrance Day for Road Traffic Victims.

Back in 2005, the UN adopted a resolution which called for governments to mark the third Sunday in November each year as this special remembrance day. It allows us to pause & reflect on the tragedies & heartbreaks. Since records began, 23,592 people have died on Irish roads. That is roughly the population of Tralee, Co. Kerry. A further 76,586 have suffered serious, life-changing injuries since we began recording them in 1977. Already this year, more than 160 families, friends & communities have lost a loved one. It's impossible to put an exact figure on the number of family members, relatives, friends & work colleagues who have been affected but it is estimated that for every death about 100 people are impacted.

The RSA has set up a 'Wall of Remembrance' on its Facebook page www.facebook.com/RSAireland. This is a place for people to come & share their memories, to light a candle & leave a memorial message for a loved one who has been killed or seriously injured on our roads. PARC Road Safety Group will hold their 16th Annual Remembrance Event in Sligo Southern Hotel, 2-4 pm on Sunday, 16th November



Pope Francis has raised an Irish Jesuit priest, Father John Sullivan, one step closer to sainthood by authorising a declaration that he lived a life of heroic virtue.

Fr Sullivan, born in Dublin in 1861 the son of a mixed marriage. His father, the future Lord Chancellor of Ireland, Sir Edward Sullivan, was a Protestant. His mother, Lady Bessie Josephine Sullivan, was a Catholic. Fr Sullivan was raised a Protestant but was received into the Catholic Church at the age of 35. Twelve years later, he was ordained a Jesuit and soon began teaching at Clongowes Wood College near Sallins, Co Kildare, where he spent most of the rest of his life. He died in 1933 after a lifetime of prayer, asceticism & ministering to the sick & the poor who he used to visit regularly on his bicycle while living in Clongowes. In 1960 Pope John the Twenty-Third declared him a Servant of God and his remains were transferred from Clongowes to Saint Francis Xavier's Church in Dublin's Gardiner Street. An official Vatican statement reveals that last Friday Pope Francis authorised the Vatican's Congregation for the Causes of Saints to promulgate decrees on the heroic virtues of eight people including a Chilean bishop & seven Europeans including Father Sullivan. According to the Vatican, a Decree of Heroic Virtues is a judgment of the Congregation that a Servant of God "lived a life of profound union with God and fidelity to Church teaching". The next stage in the process would be beatification which would require Vatican approval of a miracle brought about by Fr Sullivan's intercession. After being made "Blessed" the candidate normally requires a second miracle to be attributed to his intercession in order to qualify for sainthood.

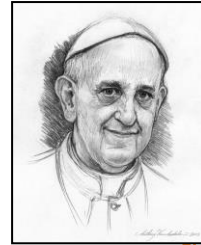
