Inside this vast story sweeping from Creation to the Kingdom, there is a space for all the little stories of the many people who feel invisible and insignificant and who are easily overlooked. Whatever pain or suffering or joy we may experience, it is somewhere there in the story of Christ's life.

Whatever experiences we may have, they have their place in the drama of the Christian year that will unfold before us.

In the Gospel we see Jesus meeting lepers, who were despised, and widows with their mites, who were never acknowledged or even noticed. Let us keep in mind that in the story of God's friendship, love and mercy with humanity, everyone is significant.

In our world that is threatened by ecological disasters and the war on terrorism, we turn again to the theme of Pope Francis and pray that our world leaders will 'overcome indifference and win peace'. Yes, we believe that God will be faithful to humanity, and in this Year of Mercy, our world will ultimately 'overcome indifference and win peace'.

May the hope that Zechariah prays for bring 'light to those in darkness and in the shadow of death and guide us in the way of peace', (Lk 1:79), as we 'overcome indifference and win peace' in 2016.
