I've always loved fish, since my Dad would arrive home form work in CIE and if he had been to the "deep water quay" there was a chance of some fish for "evening tea". Kippers + herrings, mackerel or cod could be found on your plate and I loved it. My mother particularly hated when Dad arrived with kippers – "they stank kitchen out". We have access to fish more easily now and, of course, we can go fishing too because we live by the shore. There is nothing more delightful than to catch your own fish. The beauty of the ocean, we see so often, maybe we can take it for granted, but it provides a livelihood for many people. Seafaring is a way of life for many people and they certainly contribute to society. They are often a hidden workforce who risk their lives to provide food for us. Seafaring is not easy – away from family for months + working in tough conditions and dangerous seas. The Scriptures remind us that some work all might and catch nothing. Quota difficulties yet put huge pressure on fishermen, and unhealthy working conditions and loneliness. Our church has always provided ministry at ports for seafarers – offering place to rest, safety and relaxation when docked, offering spirited comfort, religious services + companionship. May the Lord who called fishermen, bless and protect all who serve on the seas. So when next we eat mackerel/ cod offer a prayer of thanks + think of these who works hard for our comfort.
