

THIS WEEK'S SAINTS AND FEASTS

MONDAY

St Francis of Assisi, 1181-1226, abandoned all things for the love of Christ, founded the Friars Minor, and with St Clare, the Poor Clares. For the last two years of his life he suffered the stigmata. Patron saint of ecologists.

TUESDAY

St Faustina born in Glogowiec, near Łódź, Poland, in 1905, died in Kraków in 1938, her short life spent as a Sister of Our Lady of Mercy. Listening to the Lord who is Love and Mercy she understood that no human wretchedness could measure itself against the mercy which ceaselessly pours from the heart of Christ. She inspired the movement dedicated to proclaiming and imploring Divine Mercy throughout the world.

WEDNESDAY

St Bruno, born Cologne 1033. He became professor of theology in Rheims University and later its head. But his desire was to found a monastery where poverty, manual work, silence and worship would be the basics. He founded the Carthusians at La Grande Chartreuse, where he died in 1101.

SATURDAY

St John Henry Newman was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI at Cofton Park, Birmingham, on 19 September 2010 and canonised 13 October 2019. The memorial of the new saint is 9 October, the anniversary of his reception into the Catholic Church on 9 October 1845. The Church in Ireland is deeply aware of St John Henry's gentle scholarship, deep human wisdom and profound love for the Lord. It also recalls his connections with Ireland. Though his project on the establishment of the Catholic University of Ireland was not a great success, his reflection on education was written in part when he lived in Dublin and has remained a vital contribution to an understanding of Christian education. Invited to Ireland in 1850, he became Rector of the Catholic University of Ireland in 1854 until his resignation in 1858.

The Mission and Witness of the Confirmed

Through Confirmation, our personal relationship with Christ is strengthened. The Holy Spirit bestows seven gifts - wisdom, understanding, right judgement, courage, knowledge, reverence and wonder and awe in God's presence - to assist us in our mission and witness. The impact of these gifts accompanies us in the various stages of our spiritual development. As the confirmed, we walk with the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit and bear the twelve fruits of the Holy Spirit.
