MARCH FOR LIFE - Monday 1st May 23 in Dublin to speak up for life.

If you have been following the news this week, you will know that what has been published by the Minister For Health in the Report of the three year review of the abortion law is very alarming. As well as seeking to strip away the limited remaining safeguards around the abortion law (like the three day period of reflection which has saved thousands of lives), the report also recommends some far reaching changes around late term abortion, abortion in the case of life limiting conditions, amendment to the 12 week time limit for abortion on request and regrettably seeks to exert pressure on doctors who do not want to be involved in life-ending procedures.

Then there are the things that are missing from the report.

There is no mention about promoting positive alternatives to abortion for women despite the fact that a devastating 8,500 abortions took place in Ireland last year alone, representing one baby being aborted for every seven being born. There is no interest in dealing with the inhumanity of the law (around issues like foetal pain relief in late term abortion) and a glaring lack of interest in interrogating the soaring abortion rates in Ireland. There will be more about the report and how we can respond in the Seanad in the coming weeks but for today, you are encouraged to join in the **March For Life taking place next Monday, 1st May and starting at St. Stephen's Green South (opposite Newman University Church) at 2pm.**

The March For Life will be drawing together thousands of people to stand up for life in response to the recommendations in the abortion review report this week. It's very important that political representatives see a mobilised and united response to the report and a commitment to be politically active at election time on this issue.

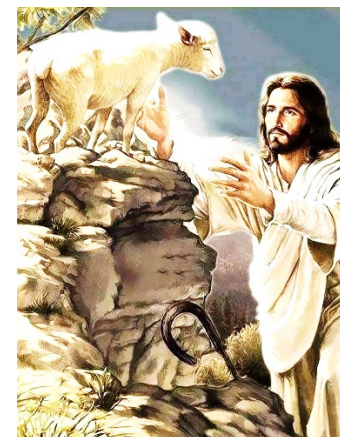
