Novena to the Immaculate Conception – 29 November – 7 December – Solemnity 8 December: Rosary – Litany of our Lady. A bouquet of roses will be presented to Our Lady on Dec 8 on behalf of all making the novena.

The 8 December is a holy day of obligation as decreed by the Irish Bishops in Loughrea on 7 Dec 1650

Painting - The Irish Madonna - Our Lady Oueen and Patroness of Ireland which went blood. On St Patrick's Day 1697 this beautiful painting went blood for 3 hours. - On the night of 7 December 1750, when the Cromwellian persecution of Ireland was raging, the Irish Bishops gathered in the old Carmelite Abbey of Loughrea, Co. Galway, at the invitation of Bishop Walter Lynch, Bishop of Clonfert, and before this painting of Our Lady Comforted of the Afflicted, solemnly proclaimed Our Lady as the Queen and Patroness of the kingdom of Ireland. The Bishops decreed that as a perpetual memorial of this proclamation that the Feast of the Immaculate Conception should be observed in Ireland on 8 December as a holy day of obligation until the end of time. This was 204 years before the Dogma of the Immaculate Conception and the institute of the feast day by the universal church and 208 years before Our Lady appeared to St Bernadette of Lourdes telling little Bernadette "I am the Immaculate Conception" - In 1651 Bishop Lynch had to flee Ireland and brought the precious painting of Our Lady with him. He first took refuge on Inishboffin island and from there went to Vienna where he met Bishop Pusky of Gyor, Hungry who gave him refuge in his diocese and where he became assistant Bishop. - In 1663, Bishop Walter Lynch was set to return to Ireland but died the day before setting sail and so the painting of Our Lady Queen and Patroness of the Kingdom of Ireland remained in Hungry. The painting was placed in the altar of St Annes in Gyor Cathedral. - On St Patrick's Day 1697, the day after the Act of Banishment was passed in Ireland, at 6am Angelus time, during morning Mass, the painting started to weep copious droplets. The supernatural event continued until 10am in the morning. - Many people witnessed the miracle. The blood on the painting was collected with linen cloths and droplets of blood continued to goze from the painting described as if sweating blood. A local rabbi also witnessed the miracle. The linen cloths are kept in a religuary in the Cathedral of Gyor. - The gold crowns on the heads of Jesus and Mary were added to the painting at a later date. The painting is venerated as Our Lady of Gyor and known as the Irish Madonna of Europe. Children in Hungry in pilgrimage to honour the Irish Madonna. A gift of a replica painting was painted in Hungry and left face to face for 4 hours with the original painting consecrated by the Irish bishops. The replica is in St Brendan's Cathedral in Loughrea Abbey. Our Lady Queen and Patroness of Ireland and Comforter of the Afflicted pray for us. Our Lady Comforter of the Afflicted is one of the titles of Our Lady in the Litany of Loreto. There are a number of different novena prayers to the Immaculate Conception. A number of Popes and saints have written noven prayers in honor of the Immaculate Conception. St Faustina prepared for the feast day by making 1000 Hail Mary's a day. The painting the Irish Bishops proclaimed as Queen and Patroness of the Kingdom of Ireland in 1650 is also known as Our Lady Comforter of the Afflicted. On 21 August 1879, 229 years after the proclamation by the Irish Bishops in 1650, Our Lady appeared in Knock wearing a crown of gold, accompanied by her beloved husband St Joseph, Jesus as the Lamb of God and St John the Apostle. Our Lady Queen and Patroness of the Kingdom of Ireland and Comforter of the Afflicted, Pray for us. "The most Blessed Virgin was from the first moment of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege of Almighty God and by virtue of the merits of Jesus Christ, Saviour of the human race, preserved immune from all original sin" Pope Pius IX who proclaimed the dogma of the Immaculate Conception.

O Mary conceived without sin pray for us who have recourse to thee.

Blessed be the holy and immaculate conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary

We fly to thy protection O Holy Mother of God, despise not our petitions on our necessities, but deliver us always from all dangers O glorious and blessed Virgin. Amen ~ Ave Ave Ave Maria~
