Saints of the week - April 24th St Fidelis, Priest & Martyr, 1578 – 1622. Born in Sigmaringen in Germany. Joined the Capuchin Friars at 35. Great Preacher and ordered by the Congregation for the propagation of the Faith to preach in Grisons (part of Switzerland). Murdered by a Calvinist mob at Seewis on 24th April 1622.

April 25th Feast of St Mark. He was a cousin of Barnabas and accompanied the Apostle Paul on his first missionary journey; later he followed him to Rome. He was a disciple of Peter and his Gospel is told from Peter's point of view. He is credited with the foundation of the Church in Alexandria in 828. The city of Venice adopted him as its patron saint, naming its Cathedral in his honour.

April 27th – c.490 AD. Asicus was converted to Christianity by St Patrick who made him Bishop of Elphin. He is our Patron Saint. The first Cathedral in our diocese was built in the village of Elphin, the ruins of which are still there in the centre of Elphin. Asicus left Elphin and retired to Rathlin Island in Donegal Bay to monastic life. Later his fellow monks encouraged him to return and on that journey he died at the townland of Rathcung – on the left of the village of Ballintra where he was laid to rest. A monument was erected there. It lies on a hill on the western side of the N15 in Ballintra (some 20 miles north of us here). A beautiful stained glass window of St Asicus in our Cathedral in Sligo, designed by Lucien-Leopold Lobin (1837-1892).
