Ash Wednesday - Taking the ashes is a public sign that one is going to do something for Lent. We can give up something or take on. Giving up something we like is self-denial. It is the best way for training our willpower. Sports people know that skills are perfected by constant repetition. Virtues are perfected by habitual practice. Our willpower is perfected by the constant habit of self-denial. - Lent is a great incentive to take on some special action for a few weeks. Maybe avail of a retreat; more prayer at home; go to Mass more often. Replace compulsive television or internet by some spiritual reading. People who are addicted to computers or smartphones might consider one day each week free from gadgets, apart from what is necessary for work. Almsgiving is also mentioned in the Gospel. Having a box at home for a Third World charity is a great reminder. One other idea from the gospel is, don't be going around with a gloomy look, a sourpuss. Our works of penance are of little use if they do not bring us closer to God. And closer to God ought to be a source of great joy. Pass the message up to your face. Lent is a season of grace.

Forms of Friday Penance: The following are suggested as ways of fulfilling Friday Penance:

- Abstaining from meat or some other food
- Abstaining from alcoholic drink or smoking
- Making a special effort at involvement in family prayer
 Making a special effort to participate in Mass on Fridays
- Visiting the Blessed Sacrament
- Making the stations of the cross
- Fasting from all food for a longer period than usual and perhaps giving what is saved to the needy Helping the poor, sick, old or lonely.
