Vocation Sunday 2026 – Guided and protected by the risen Christ, we celebrate the 4th Sunday of Easter, also called *Good Shepherd Sunday*- the 63rd World Day of Prayer for Vocations. It is an occasion of grace in which we share some reflection on the interior dimension of vocation, understood as the discovery of free gift that blossoms in the dept of your heart. **The way of beauty - The Good Shepherd** – one who is perfect, authentic & exemplary, giving his life for his sheep. The true shepherd is one that draws us to himself, whose gaze reveals that life is truly beautiful when one follows him. Vocation is the adventure of love and happiness. Every vocation begins with an awareness of God's love, a personal encounter that transforms ones life. A vocation entails the ultimate dialogue with the one who calls & invites you to a fruitful life calling you to put your talents top use. Make time for prayer, for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Every vocation is a gift for the Church revealing itself at every step of life's journey, a continual act of trusting in the Lord. Consider St. Joseph despite the mystery revealed in a dream welcomed Mary and her child. Cultivate firm & steadfast trust in God's promises. A vocation is a dynamic process of maturation sustained by intimacy with the Lord – allowing the Holy Spirit to act in our hearts & in the circumstances of our lives. A vocation is not an immediate possession – something given once and for all. Instead, it is a path that unfolds much like life itself. Pause, listen & entrust yourself through prayer and in this way a vocation matures.
